



To earn this badge, you must:

- Be aged between 5-15 years old.
- Apply for the Book badge online using the uploader form
- Tell them about a book you have read and what you think about it. Maybe you liked the characters, or perhaps you enjoyed going on exciting adventures in faraway places.
- Upload your illustration of a character or a scene from the story. This could be a drawing, painting or even digital artwork.







Multiplication Circle

What you need: someone to call the numbers and 10 items.



How to play:

- Place the items in a large circle.
- The player begins in the middle of the circle.
- Someone calls a number between 1 10. The player must collect the number of items called from the outside of the circle and place them in the middle of the circle
- Players can only move one item at a time.
- After a few rounds make this harder by adding a multiplication question to the game e.g. 7 would mean the player must place 7 items in the centre of the circle leaving three on the outside. The player must then call the answer to 7×3 . They return all the items to the outside to begin again.

How quickly can you move the items?
